Serving as an officer is an invaluable leadership training opportunity for you and your colleagues. Participation in STTACC sends a clear message to your campus and the community college system that your institution is committed to training and professional development.

Type or print in ink. Please complete each section fully, do not leave it blank. Applications must be signed by the applicant and submitted electronically to PresidentElect@sttacc.net by October 31, 2015. Your signature indicates you have your supervisor's approval and support to serve. Resumes are not accepted in lieu of this application and will not be reviewed. Letters of support are encouraged but not required and should be attached with your application.

The term of office for this position is one year. There is an average time commitment of eight hours during fall, winter, and spring quarters and 2 days for the annual conference held in August. This time commitment includes a mandatory full day board meeting per quarter, attendance at the annual conference, and the performance of the duties of the office. Depending on where the board meeting is located there may be travel and an overnight stay. Please be sure to obtain permission from our supervisor <u>before</u> submitting an application. Your signature on the application form indicates you have already received permission.

The responsibilities for Secretary include:

- Attend all STTACC business meetings and annual conferences.
- Take and transcribe minutes of all STTACC business meetings and distribute them to the executive board in a timely manner.
- Create and distribute announcements of new STTACC officers to member entities, college presidents, personnel directors, training committees, and executive board members
- Assisting the STTACC President in creation and distribution of printed information and correspondence in connection with STTACC business.
- Assisting in planning the Annual Conference and acting as an official conference host.
- Submitting the Annual Conference dates to the State Board for Community and Technical Colleges for inclusion in Community College News.
- Assisting the STTACC Treasurer with correspondence, membership, billings, and reports as needed.
- Serving on any sub-committee designated by the STTACC President.

Lake Washington Institute of Technology (LWTech)

LWTech's Community Garden - Spring Blooms & Fall Bounty

How wonderful it was to see children, teachers, parents, staff, faculty, Early Childhood Education lab students, grandparents and siblings, and the entire community coming together to create a beautiful and functional garden for the children and families at the ELC. The project included removing weeds and then leveling the dirt in the area, raised wooden garden beds and two lower beds along with a tepee trellis. Many new friendships and relationships were formed and strengthened as a result. In an effort to strengthen home to school connections, the families were asked what they wanted to see the children plant and they provided the seeds, and the LWTech Horticulture department helped the children plant the seeds. The children showed such delight planting those seeds during their fieldtrip to the greenhouse and then when they brought the young plants over to our garden and planted the plants in the raised garden beds that the volunteers had made. Every child can show with pride exactly which one(s) he/she planted.

Now we are moving into phase 2 of the garden project which involves creating learning centers and activities in the garden for children to engage with such as wagons, watering cans, benches to sit together on, games to play, and other elements that they can get creative and tinker around with including a tic-tac-toe board made from tree stumps.

We will continue to reach out to the LWTech College community to make connections. So far we have partnered with 7 different College Departments:

- We are launching a "farm to table" initiative with the Culinary Department and we will conduct Quarterly Cooking Classes with the children starting in the fall.
- We are also including some vegetables from our garden into the Fall **Foundation** Breakfast such as zucchini for bread to feature our harvest (and the children's love and care for their plants that went into it).
- The Architectural Technology Department crafted a virtual garden blueprint for possible future improvements for the garden including a stairway and entryway onto the deck.
- The Welding Department is meeting with us in the fall to discuss building an arched trellis for a fun entryway into the garden space and other garden decorations including possibly a fountain.
- The Marketing Department is sifting through our garden photographs and has formulated a publicity plan that includes social media outlets and possibly a local newspaper.





- The **Horticulture Department** will meet with the children quarterly to talk about plants, to plant seeds, and to teach us about the different plants that thrive during all seasons of the year.
- And finally, we plan to meet with the **Public Health Department** here at the College to discuss teaching the children about nutrition and healthy food from our garden.

Parents are invited to bring in seeds throughout the year that the children can plant in the garden so that they can help decide what we will grow and cultivate and then ultimately enjoy eating together.

Region E College Updates

On Tuesday, September 22, Bates Technical College kicked off a year-long celebration of the college's 75th anniversary during employee Opening Day.

Beginning with a proclamation from Governor Jay Inslee designating the day Bates Technical College 75th Anniversary Day, employees watched short videos, heard department updates, and finished the morning with birthday cupcakes.

The main events of the 2015-2016 celebratory year include a community-focused grand opening of the new Advanced Technology Center building at Central/Mohler Campus in January, and a formal gala at the new building on Saturday, May 21, 2016.

Founded in 1940, the college opened on September 4 as the Tacoma Vocational-Technical Institute in the basement of Hawthorne Elementary School. The training programs were developed because of the need to offer workforce education in Pierce County aimed at supporting the war effort.

In 1945, the institute moved to 11th Street and Yakima Avenue in Tacoma, the current site of the college's Downtown Campus location. In 1969, the institute was renamed L. H. Bates Vocational-Technical Institute to honor the service of longtime director of vocational education L. H. "Verne" Bates. Legislation signed by Governor Booth Gardner in 1991 resulted in Bates becoming a part of the two-year college system, renaming the institute Bates Technical College.

The college is Washington state's oldest, continuously-running public technical college, and plays a significant role in our economy. Graduates and former students contribute \$241.1 Million in added income to the regional economy each year. According to the state's Education Research and Data Center, the five-year median salary for Bates Technical College students who graduated during the 2007-2008 academic year, was more than \$53,000—higher than any other public two-year college statewide.



HEALTH AND WELLNESS CENTER RENOVATION

The construction of TCC's new Health & Wellness Center began on July 20. This project will expand and renovate the gym and fitness center, in Building 20, and is being funded through a COP (Certificate of Participation) process in partnership with the Associated Students of TCC (ASTCC). The new center will provide a much needed large gathering space that can be used to hold Commencement on campus. The project will be completed in two phases, to allow the building to be used during the construction process. Offices, exercise spaces and locker rooms will be relocated as needed. The new center should be ready for use by spring 2017.



ctcLink Update

On August 24, Tacoma Community College (and Spokane Community College) launched the new ctcLink (also know as PeopleSoft) system. This online administrative system has replaced the old legacy system and will streamline processes throughout the 34 public community and technical colleges in Washington. The day was spent activating new accounts, navigating the system and logging service tickets with local help desks and the SBCTC/ctcLink Service Desk. By the end of the day, over a thousand people had activated their account in ctcLink; about a quarter of them were student accounts. Over 135 service tickets were logged to the SBCTC/ctcLink Help Desk. Almost 65 percent were quickly resolved. The majority of those issues were login and security-related.
